Sealing Your Record Cannot:

- Automatically restore your gun rights if you were convicted of a felony
- Allow you to have guardianship over another person (usually)
- Stop your record from being used against you in a trial, by the police, or by the prosecutor if you are arrested or go to court
- Block access by employers in law enforcement, daycare, nursing homes, and teaching

Next Criminal Record Sealing Clinic

Records may still be seen by:

- Law Enforcement
- Prosecutors
- ACIC (Arkansas Crime Information Center)
- Criminal justice agencies in relation to employment applications or background checks under certain acts
- Polygraph Examiners, Private Security Agencies, and Private Investigators

Getting Started

Court Fees

Pay off ALL fines, fees, and restitution (costs) for the charge you want to seal

Probation

Finish probation, as well as any classes or other conditions

Driver's License Fees

If your driver's license was suspended because of your charge, you have to get your driver's license reinstated before you seal your record

ASAP

Do this as soon as possible since some charges require a waiting period after you complete the terms of your sentence

Background Check

Go to the ACIC website, www.acic.org, to request a printout of your criminal history

Representation

Contact an attorney or look for a Sealing Clinic event in your area

Records that Cannot be Sealed:

- Sex offenses
- Y felonies
- Other offenses depending on your record

Sealing your record is complicated, and we strongly recommend speaking to an attorney for assistance.
